Manage Power

To conserve electricity, the printer comes with the following features:

Sleep mode

Power usage is reduced while in Sleep mode. The printer goes into low-power mode after 5 minutes of inactivity.



To change the time to Sleep mode:

1. Open the embedded web server (EWS). For more information, see [Open the embedded web server](#).
2. Click the **Settings** tab.
3. In the **Power Management** section, click **Energy Save Mode** and select the desired option.
4. Click **Apply**.


Auto-Off

Auto-Off is automatically enabled by default when you turn on the printer. When Auto-Off is enabled, the printer will automatically turn off after 2 hours of inactivity to help reduce energy use. **Auto-Off turns the printer off completely, so you must use the Power button to turn the printer back on.** For printer models with wireless or Ethernet network capability, Auto-Off is automatically disabled when the printer establishes a wireless or Ethernet network connection. Even when Auto-Off is disabled, the printer enters Sleep mode after 5 minutes of inactivity to help reduce energy use.

1. Open the embedded web server (EWS). For more information, see [Open the embedded web server](#).
2. Click the **Settings** tab.
3. In the **Power Management** section, click **Auto Off** and select the desired option.
4. Click **Apply**.

 **CAUTION:** Always turn the printer off properly, using either Auto-Off or  (the **Power** button).

If you improperly turn the printer off, the print carriage might not return to the correct position, causing problems with the ink cartridges and print quality issues.

 **NOTE:** The printer's Sleep Mode and Auto-Off features are temporarily not available if one or more of the ink cartridges are missing. After the cartridge is reinstalled, these features resume.

Optimize Printing Supplies

To optimize printing supplies such as ink and paper, try the following:

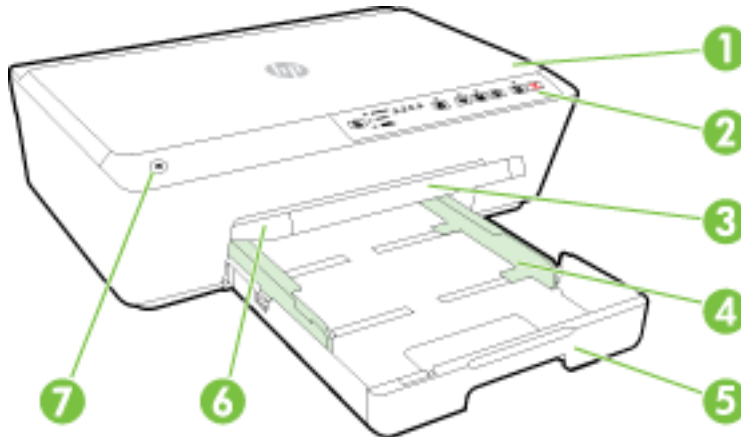
- Recycle used original HP ink cartridges through HP Planet Partners. For more information, visit www.hp.com/recycle.
- Optimize paper usage by printing on both sides of the paper.
- Save ink and paper when printing web content with HP Smart Print. For more information, visit www.hp.com/go/smartprint.
- Change the print quality in the printer driver to a draft setting. The draft setting uses less ink.
- Do not clean the printhead unnecessarily. Doing so wastes ink and shortens the life of the cartridges.

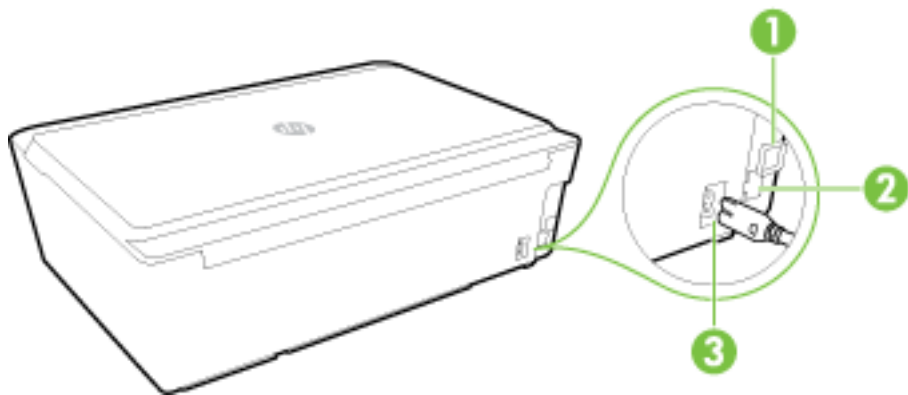

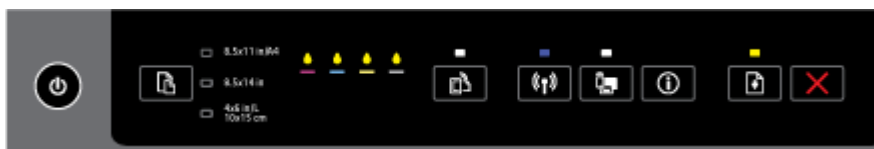

Overview of buttons and lights

The following diagram and related table provides a quick reference to the printer control panel features.



Label	Name and Description
	Power button Turns the printer on or off. It is dimmed when the printer is in sleep mode.
	Paper Size Selection button and lights Use the  (Paper Size Selection) button to select the paper size you have loaded in the input tray. Each time you press the button, the light will move downwards to the next light, selecting the paper size corresponding with the light. At the bottom light, pressing the button selects the top light and its corresponding paper size. Paper sizes listed on the printer control panel include 8.5 x 11 in/A4, 8.5 x14 in, or 4 x6 in/L/10 x 15 cm.
	Ink cartridge lights Provide information about the printhead and ink cartridges, such as the status of estimated ink levels and problems with the cartridges or printhead.
	HP ePrint button and light Turns HP ePrint on or off, and indicates the connection to Web Services, including HP ePrint.
	Wireless button and light Turns the wireless feature on or off and indicates the status of the printer's wireless connection.
	HP wireless direct button and light Turns HP wireless direct on or off.
	Information button Prints an information page focused on connectivity and Web Services, information, and help. This button can also be used along with other buttons to print more detailed information about specific functions in the printer.
	Resume button and light Resumes a job after a disruption (for example, after loading paper or clearing a paper jam).
	Cancel button Cancels a print job or maintenance procedure that is in progress.




The Power light is on.

The printer is ready. No action is required.
The Power light blinks.

The printer is turning on or off, or is processing a print job.
— No action is required.
The printer is pausing for the ink to dry.
— Wait for the ink to dry.

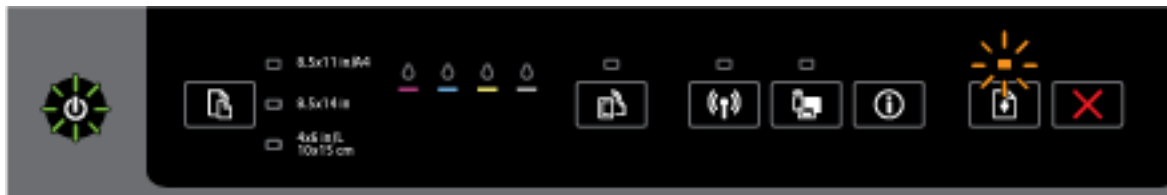

The Power light and the Resume light blink.




One of the following problems might have occurred.


1. Print media is jammed in the printer.

- Locate and clear the jam. For more information, see [Clear paper jams](#).

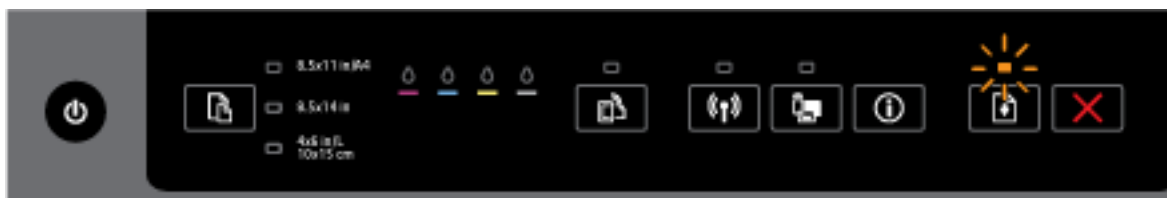
Press the  (**Resume**) button to continue printing.

2. The printer carriage has stalled.

- Open the ink cartridge access door and remove any obstructions (such as jammed paper).
- Press the  (**Resume**) button to continue printing.
- If the error persists, turn the printer off, and then on again.

To cancel the print job, press the  (**Cancel**) button.

The Power light is on and the Resume light blinks.




One of the following problems might have occurred.

1. The printer is out of paper.

- Load paper and press the  (**Resume**) button to continue printing.

2. There is a paper mismatch.

Either load paper that matches the paper settings of the printer or change the paper settings through one of the following ways:

- Press the  (**Paper Size Selection**) button on the printer to select the desired paper size.
- Change the setting in the HP print driver or in the embedded web server.



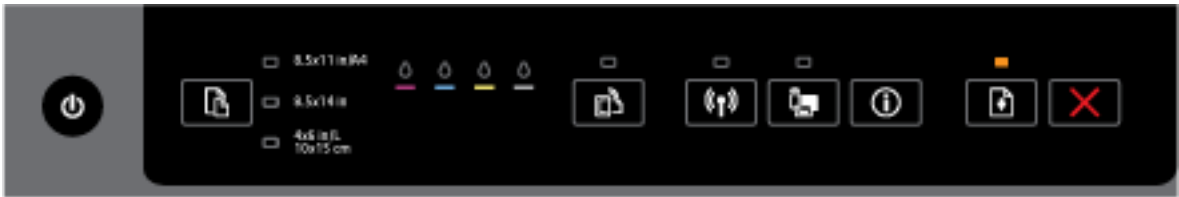
Press the  (**Resume**) button to continue printing.






The Power light is on, one or more of the ink cartridge lights are on, and the Resume light blinks.

One of the following might occur. Refer to the help message in the HP printer software for more information.
1. One or more of the ink cartridges are very low on ink. Press the  (Resume) button to continue using the existing cartridges. NOTE: Ink level alerts and indicators provide estimates for planning purposes only. When you receive a low-ink warning message, consider having a replacement cartridge available to avoid possible printing delays. You do not need to replace the cartridges until print quality becomes unacceptable.
2. One or more of the ink cartridges are counterfeit or not new. NOTE: HP cannot guarantee the quality or reliability of non-HP supplies. Product service or repairs required as a result of using a non-HP supply will not be covered under warranty. If you believe you purchased Original HP ink cartridges, go to www.hp.com/go/antcounterfeit .
3. A supply secure upgrade is detected. Press the  (Resume) button to upgrade the printer supply. If the Resume light turns off and one or more of the ink cartridge lights blink after the upgrade, the upgrade was not successful.

The Power light, the Resume light, and all of the ink cartridge lights blink.

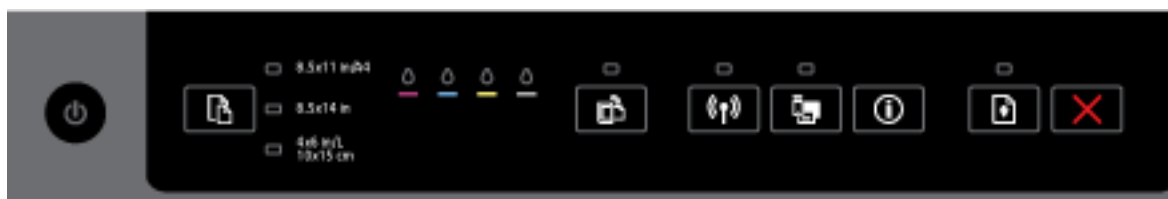

If a mandatory update for the printer is available but has not been installed, HP ePrint is turned off.

To update the printer, press the  (**HP ePrint**) button and the  (**Information**) button together, and then follow the instructions on the page that prints.

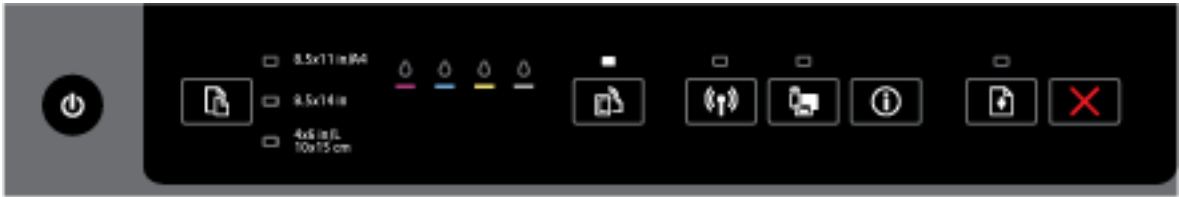

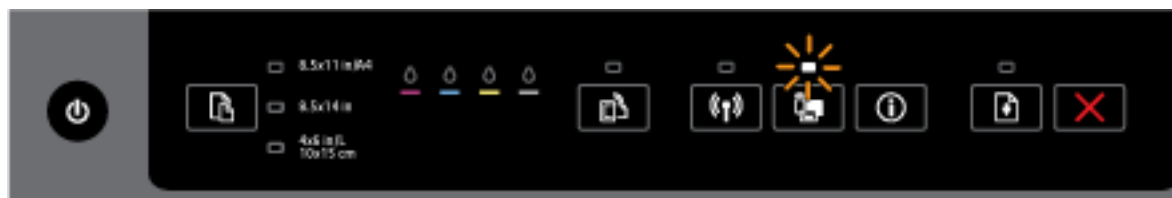

One of the Paper Size Selection lights is on.

The Paper Size Selection light that is on indicates the paper size currently set for the printer.
If you have loaded a different paper size, set the paper size in the printer to match (see Set the paper size for the printer)
For better printing experience, be sure to load paper that matches the paper settings of the printer.

One of the Paper Size Selection lights is blinking.



This occurs when you pull out the input tray. The Paper Size Selection light that is blinking indicates the paper size currently set for the printer.

- If you have loaded a different standard paper size, choose the appropriate paper size by pressing the button until the light matches the loaded paper size.
- Once you are done checking paper or loading the correct paper, close the tray properly. The light will stop blinking and become solid. If you have loaded a different paper size, set the paper size in the printer to match (see [Set the paper size for the printer](#)).
- If you press the button once when the light is blinking, blinking will also stop and the light will become solid.

For more information, see the earlier case when one of the Paper Size Selection lights is on.
All Paper Size Selection lights are off.

This occurs when the paper size currently set for the printer is not one of the sizes listed on the printer control panel; that is, it is not represented by any of the Paper Size Selection lights.
You can still print, but be sure to load paper that matches the paper settings of the printer.
All Paper Size Selection lights are blinking.

This occurs if you pull out the input tray when the paper size currently set for the printer is not listed on the printer control panel.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">— If you have loaded a different standard paper size, choose the appropriate paper size by pressing the button until the light matches the loaded paper size.— Once you are done checking paper or loading the correct paper, close the tray properly. The lights will stop blinking and turn off. For more information, see the earlier case when all the Paper Size Selection lights are off.
If you have loaded a different paper size, set the paper size in the printer to match (see Set the paper size for the printer)
<ul style="list-style-type: none">— If you press the button once when the lights are blinking, blinking will also stop and the lights will turn off.
If you press the button again, the top light will turn on and the corresponding paper size will be selected. For more information, see earlier descriptions.
The Paper Size Selection lights are cycling or blinking in sequence one after another from top to bottom (for about 10 seconds).

This occurs when you select the printer from your mobile device and the device gets connected to the printer.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">— After the connection is made, the lights will blink in sequence for about 10 seconds and revert to the state before the connection was made. For more information, see the other Paper Size Selection light patterns.— If you press the button once when the lights are blinking, blinking will stop and the lights will revert to the previous state.
If you press the button again, the next light will turn on and the corresponding paper size will be selected. For more information, see earlier descriptions.

Tips for selecting and using paper

For the best results, observe the following guidelines.

- Load only one type of paper at a time into a tray.
- When loading the tray, make sure the paper is loaded correctly.
- Do not overload the tray.
- To prevent jams, poor print quality, and other printing problems, avoid loading the following paper in the tray:
 - Multipart forms
 - Media that is damaged, curled, or wrinkled
 - Media with cutouts or perforations
 - Media that is heavily textured, embossed, or does not accept ink well
 - Media that is too lightweight or stretches easily
 - Media that contains staples or clips

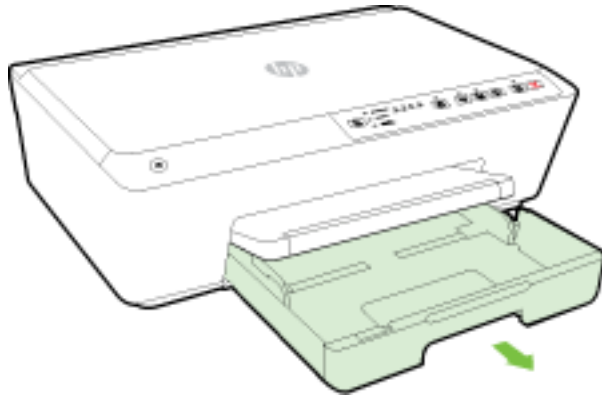


To load an envelope

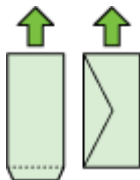

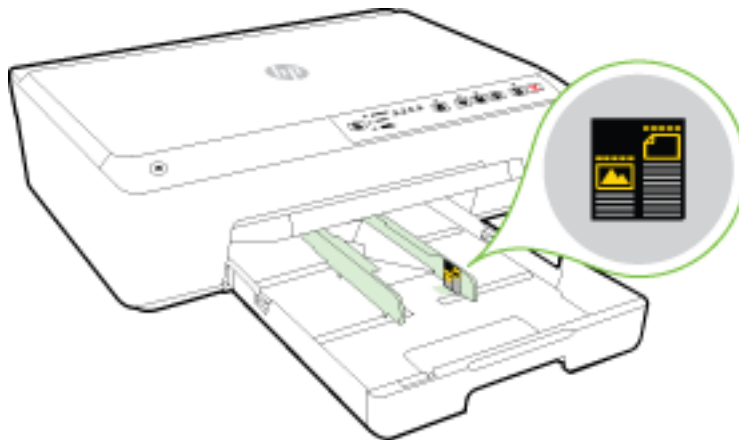

 - **Borderless Printing:** Select this feature to print photos without border. Not all paper types support this feature. You will see an alert icon beside the option if the selected paper type in the **Media** drop-down list does not support it.
 - **Layout:** This feature only works with the duplex printing. If the image is larger than the printable area, select this feature to scale the page content to be within the smaller margins so that extra pages are not created.
 - **HP Real Life Technologies:** This feature smooths and sharpens images and graphics for improved print quality.
 - **Booklet:** Allows you to print a multiple-page document as a booklet. It places two pages on each side of a sheet that can then be folded into a booklet in half size of the paper. Select a binding method from the drop-down list, and then click **OK**.
 - **Booklet-LeftBinding:** The binding side after folded into a booklet appears at the left side. Select the option if your reading habit is from left to right.
 - **Booklet-RightBinding:** The binding side after folded into a booklet appears at the right side. Select the option if your reading habit is from right to left.
 - **Page Borders:** Allows you to add the borders to the pages if you print the document with two or more pages per sheet.
- You can use printing shortcut to save time setting printing preferences. A printing shortcut stores the setting values that are appropriate for a particular kind of job, so that you can set all the options with a single click. To use it, go to the **Printing Shortcut** tab, select one printing shortcut, and then click **OK**.
 To add a new printing shortcut, after making settings on the **Layout** or **Paper/Quality** tab, click the **Printing Shortcut** tab, click **Save As** and enter a name, and then click **OK**.
 To delete a printing shortcut, select it, and then click **Delete**.



NOTE: You cannot delete the default printing shortcuts.

Printer settings tips (OS X)

- On the Print dialog, use the **Paper Size** pop-up menu to select the size of paper loaded in the printer.
- On the Print dialog, choose the **Paper Type/Quality** pop-up menu and select the appropriate paper type and quality.
- To print a black and white document using only black ink, choose the **Paper Type/Quality** from the pop-up menu. Then click the Color Options disclosure triangle and choose **Grayscale** from the Color pop-up menu and select **Black Print Cartridge Only**.

NOTE: When you receive a low-ink warning message, consider having a replacement cartridge available to avoid possible printing delays. You do not need to replace the cartridges until print quality becomes unacceptable.

AirPrint

Printing using Apple's AirPrint is supported for iOS 4.2 and Mac OS X 10.7 or later. Use AirPrint to print wirelessly to the printer from an iPad (iOS 4.2), iPhone (3GS or later), or iPod touch (third generation or later) in the following mobile applications:

- Mail
- Photos
- Safari
- Supported third-party applications, for example Evernote

To use AirPrint, ensure the following:

- The printer must be connected to the same network as your AirPrint enabled device. For more information about using AirPrint and about which HP products are compatible with AirPrint, go to www.hp.com/go/mobileprinting.
- Load paper that matches the paper settings of the printer (see [Load paper](#) and [Set the paper size for the printer](#) for more information). Accurately setting the paper size for the paper that is loaded, enables a mobile device to know what paper size it is printing.

Set the paper size for the printer


When you pull out the input tray, one or all the Paper Size Selection lights will blink (see [Control panel lights reference](#) for printer lights behaviors).

If you are loading a paper size that is not listed on the control panel, change the paper size in the HP printer software or the embedded web server (EWS). For information on how to open the printer's EWS, see [Open the embedded web server](#).



NOTE: If you pull out the input tray when there is a paper path related error, there will be no change to the way the Paper Size Selection lights are currently lit.

To change the current paper size from the printer control panel

- ▲ Continue to press the  (**Paper Size Selection**) button until the desired paper size is selected (as indicated by the Paper Size Selection light).



NOTE: If you have loaded a paper size that is not one of the sizes listed on the control panel, then the paper size will need to be set in the EWS. For information on how to open the printer's EWS, see [Open the embedded web server](#).

Setting the paper size in EWS turns off all of the paper size selection lights. The next time the input tray is opened, all three of the paper size selection lights will flash to prompt you to set the paper size of the paper loaded if it has changed.

4 HP ePrint

HP ePrint is a free service from HP that allows you to print to your HP ePrint-enabled printer anytime, from any location. It's as simple as sending an email to the email address assigned to your printer when you enable Web Services on the printer. No special drivers or software are needed. If you can send an email, you can print from anywhere, using HP ePrint.

Once you have signed up for an account on HP Connected (www.hpconnected.com), you can sign in to view your HP ePrint job status, manage your HP ePrint printer queue, control who can use your printer's HP ePrint email address to print, and get help for HP ePrint.



NOTE: To use HP ePrint, the printer must be connected to an active network providing Internet access. You cannot use these web features if the printer is connected using a USB cable.

Set up HP ePrint

To set up HP ePrint, use one of the following methods:




NOTE: Before you set up HP ePrint, make sure your printer is connected using either an Ethernet or wireless connection.

To set up HP ePrint using the embedded web server

1. Open the embedded web server (EWS). For more information, see [Open the embedded web server](#).
2. Click the **Web Services** tab.
3. In the **Web Services Settings** section, click **Setup**, and then follow the on-screen instructions.
4. If prompted, choose to allow the printer to check for and install printer updates.



NOTE: If a printer update is available, the printer downloads and installs the update, and then restarts. Repeat the instructions from step 1 to set up HP ePrint.


 **NOTE:** If prompted for proxy settings and if your network uses proxy settings, follow the on-screen instructions to set up a proxy server. If you do not have the proxy details, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the network.

5. When the printer is connected to the server, the printer prints an information page that lists the email address for the printer. Follow the instructions on the information page to finish the setup.

To set up HP ePrint using the HP printer software (Windows)

1. Open the HP printer software. For more information, see [Open the HP printer software \(Windows\)](#).
2. In the window that appears, double-click **Print**, and then select **Connect your printer to the web** under Print. The printer's home page (embedded web server) opens.
3. Click the **Web Services** tab.
4. In the **Web Services Settings** section, click **Setup**, and then follow the on-screen.
5. If prompted, choose to allow the printer to check for and install printer updates.

 **NOTE:** If a printer update is available, the printer will download and install the update, and then restart. You will have to repeat the instructions from step 1 to set up HP ePrint.

 **NOTE:** If prompted for proxy settings and if your network uses proxy settings, follow the on-screen instructions to set up a proxy server. If you do not have the proxy details, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the network.

6. When the printer is connected to the server, the printer prints an information page that lists the email address for the printer. Follow the instructions on the information page to finish the setup.

Use HP ePrint

HP ePrint allows you to print to your HP ePrint-enabled printer anytime, from any location.


To use HP ePrint, make sure to have the following:

- An Internet- and email-capable computer or mobile device
- An HP ePrint-capable printer on which Web Services has been enabled


 **TIP:** For more information about managing and configuring HP ePrint settings and to learn about the latest features, visit HP Connected at www.hpconnected.com.

To print documents using HP ePrint

1. Enable Web Services.
2. On your computer or mobile device, open your email application.

 **NOTE:** For information about using the email application on your computer or mobile device, see the documentation provided with the application.

3. Create a new email message, and then attach the file that you want to print.
4. Enter the printer's email address in the "To" line of the email message, and then select the option to send the email message.

 **NOTE:** The HP ePrint server does not accept email print jobs if there are multiple email addresses included in the "To" or "Cc" fields. Only enter the email address of your HP printer in the "To" field. Do not enter any additional email addresses in the other fields.

To find the printer's email address


1. Make sure you have created an ePrint account.

To sign up for an account, visit HP Connected at www.hpconnected.com.

2. From the printer control panel, press the  (**HP ePrint**) button and the  (**Information**) button together.

The printer prints an information page that contains the printer code and instructions on how to customize the email address.

To turn off HP ePrint

- ▲ From the printer control panel, press the  (**HP ePrint**) button.



NOTE: To remove all Web Services, see [Remove Web Services](#).

Remove Web Services

To remove Web Services, complete the following steps:

1. Open the embedded web server (EWS). For more information, see [Open the embedded web server](#).
2. Click the **Web Services** tab, and then click **Remove Web Services** in the **Web Services Settings** section.

Information on ink cartridges and the printhead

The following tips help maintain HP ink cartridges and ensure consistent print quality.

- The instructions in this user guide are for replacing ink cartridges, and are not intended for first time installation. For the first time installation, follow the instructions in the setup poster provided with the printer.
- When you turn the printer off, always use the  (**Power**) button. This allows the printer to cap the printhead and protect it from damage. For more information, see [Turn the printer off](#).
- Do not clean the printhead unnecessarily. This wastes ink and shortens the life of the cartridges.
- Handle ink cartridges carefully. Dropping, jarring, or rough handling during installation can cause temporary printing problems.
- If you are transporting the printer, do the following to prevent ink leaking from the printer or other damage from occurring to the printer:
 - Make sure you turn off the printer by pressing the  (**Power**) button. Wait until all sounds of internal motion stop before unplugging the printer. For more information, see [Turn the printer off](#).
 - The printer must be transported sitting flat; it should not be placed on its side, back, front, or top.


 **CAUTION:** HP recommends that you replace any missing cartridges as soon as possible to avoid print quality issues and possible extra ink usage or damage to the ink system. Never turn off the printer when ink cartridges are missing.


Check the estimated ink levels


You can check the estimated ink levels from the HP printer software or from the printer control panel. For information about using the HP printer software, see [Printer management tools](#).

To check the estimated ink levels from the printer control panel

- ▲ Press and hold the  (**Cancel**) button for five seconds to print the printer status report.


 **NOTE:** Ink level alerts and indicators provide estimates for planning purposes only. When you receive a low-ink alert, consider having a replacement cartridge available to avoid possible printing delays. You do not have to replace the cartridges until the print quality becomes unacceptable.

 **NOTE:** If you have installed a refilled or remanufactured cartridge, or a cartridge that has been used in another printer, the ink level indicator might be inaccurate or unavailable.

 **NOTE:** Ink from the cartridges is used in the printing process in a number of different ways, including in the initialization process, which prepares the printer and cartridges for printing, and in printhead servicing, which keeps print nozzles clear and ink flowing smoothly. In addition, some residual ink is left in the cartridge after it is used. For more information, see www.hp.com/go/inkusage.

Replace the ink cartridges


If you do not already have replacement ink cartridges for the printer, see [Order ink cartridges](#). Not all cartridges are available in all countries/regions.

 **CAUTION:** HP recommends that you replace any missing cartridges as soon as possible to avoid print quality issues and possible extra ink usage or damage to the ink system. Never turn off the printer when ink cartridges are missing.

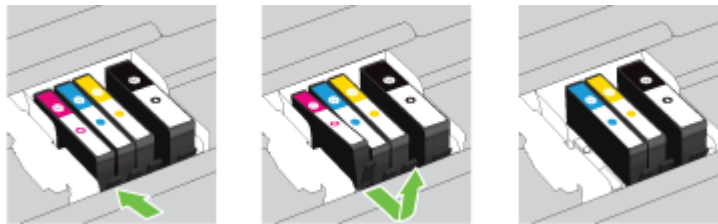
To replace the ink cartridges

1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
2. Open the ink cartridge access door.

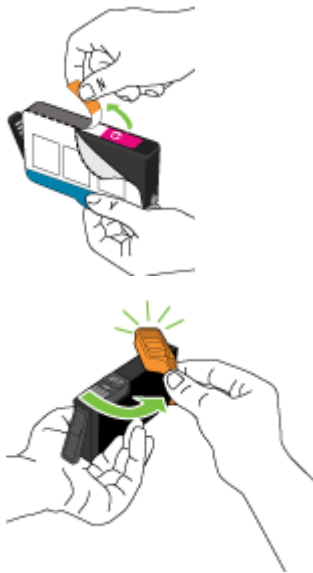
 **NOTE:** Wait until the print carriage stops moving before proceeding.



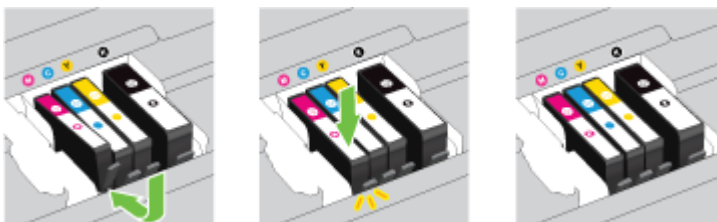
3. Press the front of the ink cartridge to release it, and then remove it from the slot.



4. Remove the new ink cartridge from its packaging.



5. Using the color-coded letters for help, slide the ink cartridge into the empty slot until it clicks securely into the slot.



Make sure that you insert the ink cartridge into the slot that has the same colored letter as the color you are installing.



6. Repeat steps 3 through 5 for each ink cartridge you are replacing.
7. Close the ink cartridge access door.

Order ink cartridges

To order ink cartridges, go to www.hp.com. (At this time, some portions of the HP website are available in English only.) Ordering cartridges online is not supported in all countries/regions. However, many countries have information on ordering by telephone, locating a local store and printing a shopping list. In addition, you can visit the www.hp.com/buy/supplies page to obtain information about purchasing HP products in your country.

Use only the replacement cartridges that have the same cartridge number as the ink cartridge you are replacing. You can find the cartridge number in the following places:

- In the embedded web server, by clicking the **Tools** tab, and then, under **Product Information** clicking **Ink Gauge**. For more information, see [Embedded web server](#).
- On the printer status report (see [Printer status report](#)).
- On the label of the ink cartridge you are replacing.
- On a sticker inside the printer. Open the ink cartridge access door to locate the sticker.



NOTE: The **Setup** ink cartridge that comes with the printer is not available for separate purchase.

Store printing supplies

- Keep all ink cartridges in the original sealed packages until they are needed.
- Ink cartridges can be left in the printer for extended periods of time. However, to assure optimal ink cartridge health, be sure to turn off the printer properly. For more information, see [Turn the printer off](#).
- Store ink cartridges at room temperature (15-35° C or 59-95° F).

Anonymous usage information storage

The HP cartridges used with this printer contain a memory chip that assists in the operation of the printer. In addition, this memory chip stores a limited set of anonymous information about the usage of the printer, which might include the following: the number of pages printed using the cartridge, the page coverage, frequency of printing, and the printing modes used.



This information helps HP design future printers to meet our customers' printing needs. The data collected from the cartridge memory chip does not contain information that can be used to identify a customer or user of the cartridge or their printer.

HP collects a sampling of the memory chips from cartridges returned to HP's free return and recycling program (HP Planet Partners: www.hp.com/recycle). The memory chips from this sampling are read and studied in order to improve future HP printers. HP partners who assist in recycling this cartridge might have access to this data, as well.


Any third party possessing the cartridge might have access to the anonymous information on the memory chip. If you prefer to not allow access to this information, you can render the chip inoperable. However, after you render the memory chip inoperable, the cartridge cannot be used in an HP printer.

If you are concerned about providing this anonymous information, you can make this information inaccessible by turning off the memory chip's ability to collect the printer's usage information.

To disable the usage information function

- ▲ On the printer control panel, press and hold the  (**Resume**) button and the  (**Information**) button together approximately five seconds, and then release the buttons.

 **NOTE:** The usage information function may be turned back on using the EWS. For information on how to open the printer's EWS, see [Open the embedded web server](#).

 **NOTE:** You can continue to use the cartridge in the HP printer if you turn off the memory chip's ability to collect the printer's usage information.

Before you begin

Ensure the following:

- The printer is not connected to the network using an Ethernet cable.
- The wireless network is set up and working properly.
- The printer and the computers that use the printer are on the same network (subnet).
- During network setup, a USB cable might be required for temporary connection, have one ready on hand and insert it when prompted.

While connecting the printer, you might be prompted to enter the wireless network name (SSID) and a wireless password.

- The wireless network name is the name of your wireless network.
- The wireless password prevents other people from connecting to your wireless network without your permission. Depending on the level of security required, your wireless network might use either a WPA passphrase or WEP key.

If you have not changed the network name or the security passkey since setting up your wireless network, you can sometimes find them on the back or side of the wireless router.

If you cannot find the network name or the security password or cannot remember this information, see the documentation provided with your computer or with the wireless router. If you still cannot find this information, contact your network administrator or the person who set up the wireless network.

Set up the printer on your wireless network

You may print a Wireless Quick Start Guide to aide in the setup of the printer on a wireless network.

To print a wireless quick start guide

- ▲ Press and hold the  (**Information**) button for three seconds.

To set up the wireless connection using the HP printer software


1. If you have not yet installed the HP printer software, insert the HP software CD into your computer, and then complete the following steps:
 - (Windows): When prompted, click **Wireless**, and then follow the on-screen instructions.
 - (OS X): Double-click the HP Installer icon on the software CD, and then follow the on-screen instructions.


If you have already installed the HP printer software on your computer, complete the following steps:

- a. (Windows): Open the printer software. For more information, see [Open the HP printer software \(Windows\)](#).
- b. **Windows 8 and 8.1:** Click **Utilities**.

- c. Click **Printer Setup & Software**.
 - d. Click **Connect a new printer**, and then follow the on-screen instructions.
 - a. (OS X): Double-click the HP Utility icon (located in the **Hewlett-Packard** folder in the **Applications** folder at the top level of the hard disk).
 - b. Click the **Applications** icon on the HP Utility toolbar.
 - c. Double-click **HP Setup Assistant**, and then follow the on-screen instructions.
2. After the printer connects successfully, the blue Wireless light stops blinking and remains on.

To set up the wireless connection from the printer control panel

Ensure your wireless router or wireless access point has a Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) button (a button with the  icon or is labeled "WPS"), and that WPS is enabled with WPA encryption.

1. From the printer control panel, press and hold the  (**Wireless**) button for three seconds. The Wireless light starts blinking.
2. On the wireless router or wireless access point, press and hold the WPS button for three seconds. Wait for about two minutes. If the printer connects successfully, the Wireless light will stop blinking and remain lit.
3. (Windows): After you have completed the wireless setup, add the printer in your computer by choosing **Add a Network Printer** from **Control Panel**, and then follow the on-screen instructions.
4. (OS X): After you have completed the wireless setup, add the printer in your computer by choosing **System Preferences**, and then follow the on-screen instructions.

If you are already using the printer with a different type of connection, such as a USB connection, follow the instructions in [Change the connection type](#) to set up the printer on your wireless network.

Change the connection type

After you have installed the HP printer software and connected the printer to your computer or to a network, you can use the software to change the connection type (for example, from a USB connection to a wireless connection).



NOTE: Connecting an Ethernet cable turns off the wireless capability of the printer.

To change from an Ethernet connection to a wireless connection (Windows)

Before you proceed, go through the list at [Before you begin](#).



NOTE: A USB cable will be used temporarily during the setup process.

1. Remove the Ethernet cable from the printer.
2. Open the printer software after the installation. For more information, see [Open the HP printer software \(Windows\)](#).
3. **Windows 8 and 8.1:** Click **Utilities**.
4. Click **Printer Setup & Software**.
5. Click **Reconfigure wireless settings**.

To change from an Ethernet connection to a wireless connection (OS X)

Before you proceed, go through the list at [Before you begin](#).

1. Connect the printer to your wireless network.
2. Use **HP Setup Assistant** in **Applications/Hewlett-Packard/Device Utilities** to change the software connection to wireless for this printer.

To change from a USB connection to a wireless network (Windows)

Before you proceed, go through the list at [Before you begin](#).

1. Depending on your operating system, do one of the following:
 - **Windows 8.1:** Click the down arrow in lower left corner of the Start screen, select the printer name, and then click **Utilities**.
 - **Windows 8:** Right-click an empty area on the Start screen, click **All Apps** on the app bar, select the printer name, and then click **Utilities**.
 - **Windows 7, Windows Vista, and Windows XP:** From the computer desktop, click **Start**, select **All Programs**, click **HP**, click the folder of your printer.
2. Click **Printer Setup & Software**.
3. Select **Convert a USB connected printer to wireless**. Follow the on-screen instructions.

To change from a USB connection to a wireless network (OS X)

Before you proceed, go through the list at [Before you begin](#).

1. Connect the printer to your wireless network.
2. Use **HP Setup Assistant** in **Applications/Hewlett-Packard/Device Utilities** to change the software connection to wireless for this printer.

To change from a wireless connection to a USB or Ethernet connection (Windows)

Add the printer to the print queue.

1. Open **System Preferences**.
2. Depending on your operating system, click **Print & Fax**, **Print & Scan**, or **Printers & Scanners** in the **Hardware** section.
3. Click + below the list of printers at the left.
4. Select the printer from the list of detected printers (the word “Bonjour” is listed the right column beside the printer name), and click **Add**.

Test the wireless connection

Print the wireless network test report for information about the printer wireless connection. The wireless network test report provides information about the printer status, hardware (MAC) address, and IP address. If the printer is connected to a network, the test report displays details about the network settings.


To print the wireless network test report

- ▲ Press the  (**Wireless**) button and the  (**Information**) button together to print the network configuration page and the wireless network test report.



You may also test the wireless setup using the EWS. To open the EWS, see [Embedded web server](#).

Change network settings

You can set up and manage your printer wireless connection and perform a variety of network management tasks. This includes printing information about network settings, turning the wireless function on or off, setting the link speed, and changing IP settings.


 **CAUTION:** Network settings are provided for your convenience. However, unless you are an advanced user, you should not change some of these settings (such as the link speed, IP settings, default gateway, and firewall settings).

To print network settings

- Press the  (**Wireless**) button and the  (**Information**) button together to print the network configuration page and the wireless network test report.

To turn on or off the wireless capability of the printer

The blue Wireless light on the printer control panel is lit when the wireless capability of the printer is on.

 **NOTE:** Connecting an Ethernet cable to the printer automatically turns off the wireless capability and the Wireless light.

- ▲ From the printer control panel, press the  (**Wireless**) button to turn the wireless capability on or off.

To change network settings using the embedded web server

Use the printer's embedded web server (EWS) to modify network settings such as link speed and IP settings.

1. Open the embedded web server (EWS). For more information, see [Open the embedded web server](#).
2. Click the **Network** tab, and then click the different network items to make changes.




Use HP wireless direct

With HP wireless direct, you can print wirelessly from a computer, smart phone, tablet, or other wireless-capable device—without connecting to an existing wireless network.

You may print an HP Wireless Direct Guide as a reference for HP wireless direct.

To print the HP Wireless Direct Guide

- Pressing the  (**HP wireless direct**) button the first time will turn on HP wireless direct and print the HP Wireless Direct Guide. The guide includes the HP wireless direct network name and password.
- After the first time, you can press the  (**HP wireless direct**) button and the  (**Information**) button together to print the HP Wireless Direct Guide.

Guidelines when using HP wireless direct

- Make sure your computer or mobile device has the necessary software.
If you are using a computer, make sure you have installed the printer software provided with the printer.
- If you have not installed the HP printer software on the computer, connect to HP wireless direct first and then install the printer software. Select **Wireless** when prompted by the printer software for a connection type.
- If you are using a mobile device, make sure you have installed a compatible printing app. For more information about mobile printing, visit www.hp.com/global/us/en/eprint/mobile_printing_apps.html.
- Make sure HP wireless direct is turned on in the printer and, if necessary, security is enabled.
- Up to five computers and mobile devices can use the same HP wireless direct connection.
- HP wireless direct can be used while the printer is also connected either to a computer using a USB cable or to a network using a wireless connection.
- HP wireless direct cannot be used to connect a computer, mobile device, or printer to the Internet.

To turn on HP wireless direct

- ▲ On the printer control panel, press the  (**HP wireless direct**) button to turn the HP wireless direct feature on.

If this is the first time you are pressing the button, the printer prints the HP Wireless Direct Guide automatically. The guide includes the network name and password for **HP wireless direct**.

To print from a wireless-capable mobile device

Make sure you have installed a compatible printing app on your mobile device. For more information, visit www.hp.com/global/us/en/eprint/mobile_printing_apps.html.

1. Make sure you have turned on HP wireless direct on the printer.
2. Turn on the Wi-Fi connection on your mobile device. For more information, see the documentation provided with the mobile device.



NOTE: If your mobile device does not support Wi-Fi, you are not able to use HP wireless direct.

3. From the mobile device, connect to a new network. Use the process you normally use to connect to a new wireless network or hotspot. Choose the HP wireless direct name from the list of wireless networks shown such as **HP-Print-**-Officejet Pro XXXX** (where ** are the unique characters to identify your printer and XXXX is the printer model located on the printer).

If HP wireless direct is turned on with security, enter the password when prompted.

4. Print your document.

To print from a wireless-capable computer (Windows)

1. Make sure you have turned on HP wireless direct on the printer.

About cookies

The embedded Web server (EWS) places very small text files (cookies) on your hard drive when you are browsing. These files let the EWS recognize your computer the next time you visit. For example, if you have configured the EWS language, a cookie helps remember which language you have selected so that the next time you access the EWS, the pages are displayed in that language. Some cookies (such as the cookie that stores customer-specific preferences) are stored on the computer until you clear them manually.

You can configure your browser to accept all cookies, or you can configure it to alert you every time a cookie is offered, which allows you to decide which cookies to accept or refuse. You can also use your browser to remove unwanted cookies.

Depending on your printer, if you disable cookies, you also disable one or more of the following features:

- Using some setup wizards
- Remembering the EWS browser language setting
- Personalizing the EWS Home page

Open the embedded web server

The printer status report also contains a log of recent events.

Network configuration page

- 1. General Information:** Shows information about the current status and active connection type of the network, and other information, such as the URL of the embedded web server.
- 2. 802.3 Wired:** Shows information about the active Ethernet network connection, such as the IP address, subnet mask, default gateway, as well as the hardware address of the printer.

3. **802.11 Wireless:** Shows information about your wireless network connection, such as the host name, IP address, subnet mask, default gateway, and server. It also indicates the network name (SSID), the relative signal strengths and the channels being used.
4. **HP Wireless Direct:** Shows information about your HP wireless direct connection, such as the status and hardware address.
5. **Miscellaneous:** Shows information about more advanced network settings.
 - **Port 9100:** The printer supports raw IP printing through TCP Port 9100. This HP-proprietary TCP/IP port on the printer is the default port for printing. It is accessed by HP software (for example, the HP Standard Port).
 - **LPD:** Line Printer Daemon (LPD) refers to the protocol and programs associated with line-printer spooling services that may be installed on various TCP/IP systems.



NOTE: The LPD functionality can be used with any host implementation of LPD that complies with the RFC 1179 document. The process for configuring printer spoolers, however, might differ. See your system documentation for information about configuring these systems.

- **Bonjour:** Bonjour services (which use mDNS, or Multicast Domain Name System) are typically used on small networks for IP address and name resolution (through UDP port 5353), where a conventional DNS server is not used.
- **SLP:** Service Location Protocol (SLP) is an Internet standard network protocol that provides a framework to allow networking applications to discover the existence, location, and configuration of networked services in enterprise networks. This protocol simplifies discovery and use of network resources such as printers, web servers, fax machines, video cameras, files systems, backup devices (tape drives), databases, directories, mail servers, calendars.
- **Microsoft Web Services:** Enable or disable the Microsoft Web Services Dynamic Discovery (WS Discovery) protocols or Microsoft Web Services for Devices (WSD) Print services supported on the printer. Disable unused print services to prevent access through those services.



NOTE: For more information about WS Discovery and WSD Print, visit www.microsoft.com.


- **SNMP:** Simple Network Management Protocol (SNMP) is used by network management applications for device management. The printer supports SNMPv1 protocol on IP networks.
- **WINS:** If you have a Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol (DHCP) server on your network, the printer automatically obtains its IP address from that server and registers its name with any RFC 1001 and 1002-compliant dynamic name services as long as a WINS server IP address has been specified.
- **IPP:** Internet Printing Protocol (IPP) is a standard network protocol for remote printing. Unlike other remote IP-based protocols, IPP supports access control, authentication, and encryption, allowing for more secure printing.
- **Proxy Settings:** Shows information about proxy address, port, and the status of authentication. You can change the proxy settings from EWS.

To change the proxy settings, click **Network** from EWS, click **Proxy Settings**, and select the appropriate options.

Print quality diagnostic report

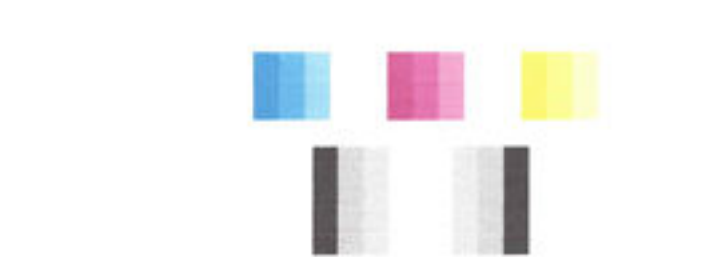
Test Pattern 1

If defects are seen on the page, follow the steps below:

1. If the Print Quality report shows faded, partial, streaked, or missing color bars or patterns, check for depleted ink cartridges, and replace the ink cartridge that corresponds to the defective color bar or color pattern. If there is no depleted ink cartridge, remove and reinstall all ink cartridges to make sure they are properly installed.

Do not remove the depleted cartridge until you have a new ink cartridge available to replace. For information about how to install new cartridges, see [Replace the ink cartridges](#).

2. If the lines in Test Pattern 1 are not straight and connected, align the printer. For more information, see [Maintain the printhead and ink cartridges](#).

Solve printer problems

 **TIP:** (Windows) Run the [HP Print and Scan Doctor](#) to diagnose and automatically fix printing, scanning, and copying issues. The application is only available in some languages.

The printer shuts down unexpectedly

- Check the power and power connections.
- Make sure the printer's power cord is connected firmly to a functioning power outlet.

Printhead alignment fails


- If the alignment process fails, make sure you have loaded unused, plain white paper into the input tray. If you have colored paper loaded in the input tray when you align the ink cartridges, the alignment fails.
- If the alignment process fails repeatedly, you may need to clean the printhead, or you might have a defective sensor. To clean the printhead, see [Maintain the printhead and ink cartridges](#).
- If cleaning the printhead does not solve the problem, contact HP support. Go to www.hp.com/support . This website provides information and utilities that can help you correct many common printer problems. If prompted, select your country/region, and then click **All HP Contacts** for information on calling for technical support.

Paper-feed problems

- **Paper is not picked up from a tray**
 - Make sure paper is loaded in the tray. For more information, see [Load paper](#). Fan the paper before loading.
 - Make sure the paper-width guides are set to the correct markings in the tray for the paper size you are loading. Also make sure the paper guides are snug, but not tight, against the stack.
 - Make sure paper in the tray is not curled. Uncurl paper by bending it in the opposite direction of the curl.
 - Make sure the stack of paper is aligned with the appropriate paper size lines on the bottom of the input tray, and does not exceed the stack height marking on the side of the tray.
- **Pages are skewing**

- Make sure the paper loaded in the input tray is aligned to the paper-width guides. If needed, pull out the input tray from the printer and reload the paper correctly, making sure that the paper guides are aligned correctly.
- Load paper into the printer only when it is not printing.
- **Multiple pages are being picked up**
 - Make sure the paper-width guides are set to the correct markings in the tray for the paper size you are loading. Also make sure the paper-width guides are snug, but not tight, against the stack.
 - Make sure the tray is not overloaded with paper.
 - Use HP paper for optimum performance and efficiency.

Solve printing problems

 **TIP:** (Windows) Run the HP Print and Scan Doctor to diagnose and automatically fix printing, scanning, and copying issues. The application is only available in some languages.

The printer is not responding (nothing prints)

- **There are print jobs stuck in the print queue**

Open the print queue, cancel all documents, and then reboot the computer. Try to print after the computer reboots. Refer to the Help system for the operating system for more information.

- **Check the HP software installation**

If the printer is turned off when printing, an alert message should appear on your computer screen; otherwise, the HP software provided with the printer might not be installed correctly. To resolve this, uninstall the HP software completely, and then reinstall the HP software.

- **Check the cable connections**

Make sure both ends of the USB cable or Ethernet cable are secure.

If the printer is connected to a network, check the following:

- Check the Link light on the back of the printer.
- Make sure you are not using a phone cord to connect the printer.

- **Check any personal firewall software installed on the computer**

The personal software firewall is a security program that protects a computer from intrusion. However, the firewall might block communication between the computer and the printer. If there is a problem communicating with the printer, try temporarily disabling the firewall. If the problem persists, the firewall is not the source of the communication problem. Re-enable the firewall.

High electromagnetic fields (such as those generated by USB cables) can sometimes cause slight distortions to printouts. Move the printer away from the source of the electromagnetic fields. Also, it is recommended that you use a USB cable that is less than 3 meters (9.8 feet) long to minimize the effects of these electromagnetic fields.

Print quality is not acceptable

1. Make sure you are using genuine HP ink cartridges. Genuine HP ink cartridges are designed and tested with HP printers to help you easily produce great results, time after time.



NOTE: HP cannot guarantee the quality or reliability of non-HP supplies. Printer service or repairs required as a result of using a non-HP supply are not covered under warranty.

2. Check the ink levels. The ink cartridges might have insufficient ink.



NOTE: Ink level alerts and indicators provide estimates for planning purposes only. When you receive a low-ink alert, consider having a replacement cartridge available to avoid possible printing delays. You do not need to replace the ink cartridges until the print quality becomes unacceptable.



CAUTION: While ink cartridges are not damaged when left outside of the printer, the printhead does need to have all cartridges installed at all times after the printer is set up and in use. Leaving one or more cartridge slots empty for an extended period may lead to print quality problems and possibly damage the printhead. If you have recently left a cartridge out of the printer for an extended period, or if you have had a recent paper jam, and have noticed poor print quality, clean the printhead. 3. Check the paper loaded in the input tray. Make sure the paper is loaded correctly and that it is not wrinkled or too thick.

- Load paper with the print side facing down. For example, if you are loading glossy photo paper, load the paper with the glossy side down.
- Make sure the paper lays flat in the input tray and is not wrinkled. If the paper is too close to the printhead during printing, the ink might be smeared. This can happen if the paper is raised, wrinkled, or very thick, such as a mailing envelope.

HP recommends that you use HP papers or any other paper type with ColorLok technology that is appropriate for the printer. All papers with the ColorLok logo are independently tested to meet high standards of reliability and print quality, and produce documents with crisp, vivid color, bolder blacks and dry faster than ordinary plain papers. Always make sure the paper you are printing on is flat. For best results when printing images, use HP Advanced Photo Paper.

Store specialty paper in its original packaging inside a resealable plastic bag on a flat surface in a cool, dry place. When you are ready to print, remove only the paper you plan to use immediately. When you have finished printing, return any unused photo paper to the plastic bag. This prevents the photo paper from curling.

5. Check the print settings by clicking the button that opens the **Properties** dialog box. (Depending on your software application, this button might be called **Properties**, **Options**, **Printer Setup**, **Printer Properties**, **Printer**, or **Preferences**.)

- Check the print settings to see if the color settings are incorrect.

For example, check to see if the document is set to print in grayscale. Or, check to see if advanced color settings such as saturation, brightness, or color tone, are set to modify the appearance of colors.

- Check the print quality setting and make sure it matches the type of paper loaded in the printer.

You might need to choose a lower print quality setting if colors are running into each other. Or, choose a higher setting if you are printing a high-quality photo, and then make sure photo paper such as HP Advanced Photo Paper is loaded in the input tray.



NOTE: On some computer screens, colors might appear differently than they do when printed on paper. In this case, there is nothing wrong with the printer, print settings, or ink cartridges. No further troubleshooting is required.

4. Run the wireless test to make sure the wireless connection is working properly.

 - b. On the printer control panel, press the  (**Wireless**) button and the  (**Information**) button together to print the network configuration page and the wireless network test report.

- If the test fails, review the test report for information on how to fix the problem and run the test again.
5. Restart components of the wireless network.
 - a. Turn off the router and the printer.
 - b. Turn the router and the printer back on in this order: router first and then printer.

Sometimes, turning off devices and then turning them back on helps resolve network communication issues. If you still cannot connect, turn off the router, the printer, and the computer, and then turn them back on in this order: router first, then printer, and then computer.



Clean the exterior

 **WARNING!** Before cleaning the printer, turn the printer off by pressing  (the **Power** button) and unplug the power cord from the electrical socket.

Use a soft, damp, lint-free cloth to wipe dust, smudges, and stains off of the case. Keep fluids away from the interior of the printer, as well as from the printer control panel.

Maintain the printhead and ink cartridges

If you are experiencing problems with printing, you might have a problem with the printhead. You should perform the procedures in the following sections only when directed to do so for resolving print quality issues.

Performing the aligning and cleaning procedures unnecessarily can waste ink and shorten the life of the cartridges.

- Clean the printhead if your printed output is streaked or has any incorrect or missing colors.

There are two stages of cleaning. Each stage lasts about two minutes, uses one sheet of paper, and uses an increasing amount of ink. After each stage, review the quality of the printed page. You should only initiate the next phase of cleaning if the print quality is poor.

If print quality still seems poor after you complete both stages of cleaning, try aligning the printer. If print quality problems persist after cleaning and aligning, contact HP support. For more information, see [HP support](#).

- The printer automatically aligns the printhead during the initial setup.

You might want to use this feature when the printer status page shows streaking or white lines through any of the blocks of color or if you are having print quality issues with your printouts.

- Clean page smears when your printed output has smearing on the back. Ink may have built up in some areas of the printer and needs to be removed.



NOTE: Cleaning uses ink, so clean the printhead only when necessary. The cleaning process takes a few minutes. Some noise might be generated in the process.

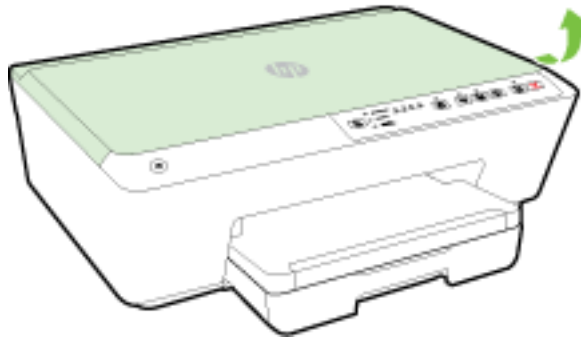
CAUTION: To prevent possible damage to the printhead, clear paper jams as soon as possible.

To clear a paper jam



CAUTION: Do not pull jammed paper from the front of the printer, instead follow the steps below to clear the jam. Pulling out jammed paper from the front of the printer might cause the paper to tear and leave torn pieces inside the printer; this could result in more jams later.

1. Open the ink cartridge access door.



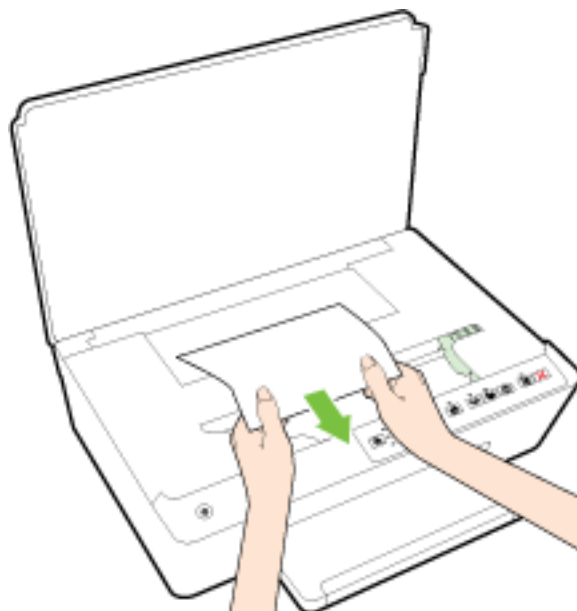
2. Check the paper path inside the printer.
 - a. Lift the handle of the paper path cover and remove the cover.



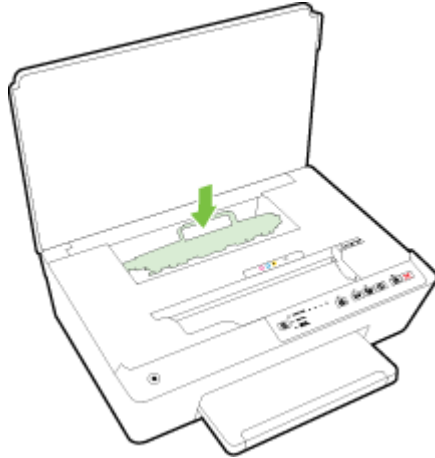
- b. Locate any jammed paper inside the printer, grasp it with both hands and pull it towards you.

⚠ CAUTION: If the paper tears when you are removing it from the rollers, check the rollers and wheels for torn pieces of paper that might be remaining inside the printer.

- c. Reinsert the paper path cover until it snaps into place.



3. If the problem is not resolved, check the print carriage area inside the printer.

CAUTION: During the process, avoid touching the cable attached to the print carriage.

- a. If there is any jammed paper, move the print carriage to the far right of the printer, grasp the jammed paper with both hands, and then pull it towards you.

CAUTION: If the paper tears when you are removing it from the rollers, check the rollers and wheels for torn pieces of paper that might be remaining inside the printer.

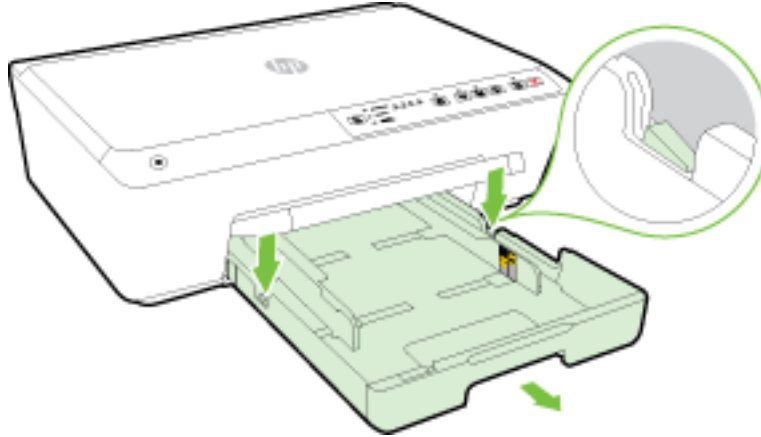

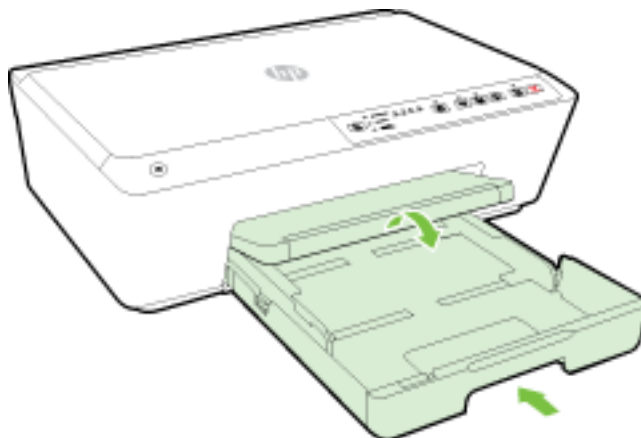
- d. Check the gap in the printer where the input tray was. If there is any jammed paper, reach into the gap, grasp the paper with both hands and pull it towards you.

CAUTION: If the paper tears when you are removing it from the rollers, check the rollers and wheels for torn pieces of paper that might be remaining inside the printer.

To avoid paper jams

To help avoid paper jams, follow these guidelines.

- Remove printed papers from the output tray frequently.
- Make sure that you are printing with paper that is not wrinkled, folded, or damaged.
- Prevent curled or wrinkled paper by storing all unused paper flat in a resealable bag.
- Do not use paper that is too thick or too thin for the printer.
- Make sure that the trays are loaded correctly and are not too full. For more information, see [Load paper](#).
- Ensure that paper loaded in the input tray lays flat and the edges are not bent or torn.
- Do not combine different paper types and paper sizes in the input tray; the entire stack of paper in the input tray must be the same size and type.
- Adjust the paper-width guides in the input tray to fit snugly against all paper. Make sure the paper-width guides do not bend the paper in the input tray.
- Do not force paper too deep inside the input tray.
- If you are printing on both sides of a page, do not print highly saturated images on light weight paper.
- Use paper types that are recommended for the printer. For more information, see [Recommended papers for printing](#).
- If the printer is about to run out of paper, allow the printer to run out of paper first, and then add paper. Do not load paper when the printer printing.
- Make sure that the printer is clean. For more information, see [Maintain the printer](#).

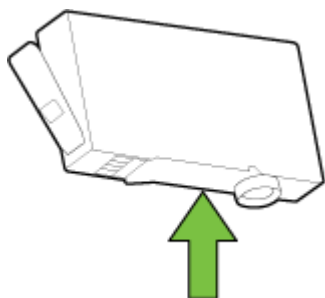
